Doosan Forklift Parts - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an intercontinental establishment consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry products, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Technologies and Machine Tools and Computerization Systems.

In the United States, Doosan Infracore America Corporation is headquartered in Suwanee, Georgia. It is home to a 170,000 square foot manufacturing facility, which is the home of the Compact Equipment and Construction division. West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Rancho Cucamonga is home to the Forklift division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction client requirements.

There are well over 220 Doosan service and sales locations operating in Canada and the United States. What's more, there are more than 90 independent dealers moving lift truck materials and materials handling equipment. This system permits Doosan Infracore America to aggressively compete in this competitive marketplace. The forklift product line remarkably comprises of 63 different products consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion forklifts. Capacities of these numerous truck versions range from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are built in an ISO 9001 certified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest emerging forklift and lift truck corporation in the North American marketplace, due to its outstanding level of product performance and their persistently high level of buyer support and service given to all Doosan Infracore Forklift users. The U.S. lift Truck division located in Cleveland has a skilled team knowledgeable in Product Sales, Purchasing, Marketing, Logistical and Technical Support.

Originally the home-based forklift market in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. began in 1960, to import fully assembled forklifts as part of a home-based machinery expansion venture. Product sales of these products were primarily targeted to state-run corporations, large scale organizations, and the armed forces. This ultimately led to a unification with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division begun trade operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a forklift manufacturing plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical education grew to become the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Daewoo started the first home-based forklift business in 1967, and rapidly acquired a whopping 90% share in the Korean Materials Handling market. By the 1980's, Daewoo's progressive technological enhancements combined with sales success placed them in a situation of substantial growth of their lift truck business.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a cooperative venture project to counter act competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This plan greatly expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was completed in 1984 to facilitate a contemporary plant which helped establish the company for the fabrication of high added-value goods suitable for export. In 1993, the corporation had a international sales system and started exporting models they had developed through in-house expertise, as an independent brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing growth opportunities into overseas markets.
